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

The Festival operates a Child Protection Policy, a copy of which is included in this programme.

All Classes will be held in the Wadebridge Town Hall, The Platt, Wadebridge. All times quoted in this programme are Class commencement times.

#### Copyright And Performing Rights: Important!

- 1. Competitors are advised to secure their music as soon as possible. Due to the Copyright Act, no unauthorised photo-copies are permissible, with the following exception: when an Own Choice work is selected from a publication containing several different works, and is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of the Adjudicator, provided that the competitor has already purchased his/ her own copy. The copy must be retained and destroyed by the administrator of the Festival immediately after the event. Should an extended photo-copy be used by the performer to avoid page turning, the original score should be available if the Adjudicator wishes to see it.
- 2. The Festival has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry or prose performed. Authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this Festival.
- 3. To comply with Performing Rights competitors are asked to announce the title of their piece and the name of the composer/writer.
- 4. No one may take photographs or make video recordings during the performances.

#### Wadebridge Festival of Music And Speech – Child Protection Policy

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals. We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.
- The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

#### Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create Safer Festivals for everyone:

A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.

One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival. Name: *Ann Jones* 

Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection leaflets, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.

Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.

All Festival personnel wear an official badge. All teachers/parents/guardians / carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition, we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.

For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take responsibility for any property left unattended. Please note all accompanying adults will be required to pay an admission fee.

No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.

Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Secretary prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks, wherever possible, to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support, or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.

The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus and Programme. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.

## The Adjudicators

#### Speech:

#### Rebecca Thompson BA (Hons) LLAM (Hons)

On graduating from Bristol University with a degree in Drama and English, Rebecca worked for BBC Radio Four's Drama Department. After further journalism and corporate work, Rebecca studied for her Licentiate Teacher's Diploma and has been teaching Speech and Drama privately and in schools for over 25 years. She has taught in private and state schools, colleges and businesses and is a facilitator for South Gloucestershire NQT Voice Training. In addition, she has been involved in communication training in schools across the country. Rebecca has been actively involved in theatre in the South West and is an Adjudicator for the Rose Bowl Awards for Amateur



Drama and Music. Rebecca has also adjudicated at the Hong Kong International festival. Rebecca loves being involved with young people in a performance context and feels strongly that the Festival movement is a way for children and young people to develop both performance and communication skills in an encouraging and constructive context. Rebecca is delighted to be returning to adjudicate at Wadebridge Festival of Music and Speech.

#### **Music:**

#### Jeffrey Williams BA (Hons), FRSA, LTCL, FTCL, PGCE

Jeffrey is a proud Cornishman and grew up just outside Camborne. His first organ lessons were at Camborne Centenary Church and St Mary's Church, Penzance. After leaving Redruth Grammar School he read music at Bath, studying organ and choir training with Dudley Holroyd at Bath Abbey and choral conducting with John (W J) Richards. Following a post-graduate course in Music Education with Bristol University he taught at schools both in the state and independent sectors, and after 27 years in music education Jeffrey left full-time teaching in order to pursue a freelance career, having already joined the panel of Music Examiners for Trinity College, London in 1999. He has examined in Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Singapore, South Africa, Thailand and India, as well as extensively in the UK. Jeffrey enjoyed a long association with the music at Romsey Abbey, which



included 14 years as Organist and Master of the Choristers. He established the choir as one of the largest and most successful all male church choirs in the South of England and, under his direction, the choir sang at most of the major Cathedrals in the country, including three visits to Westminster Abbey and two concert tours to Holland, as well as performing on local television and national BBC Radio Three. Jeffrey worked with the Royal School of Church Music as an Examiner for the School's Chorister Awards scheme and in directing choral workshops. In December 2003 he was elected as a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts for his contribution to music. As an organ recitalist he has played at many of the English Cathedrals and Major Parish Churches, as well as performances in France, Holland the USA and Hong Kong. His CD recording of the restored Walker Organ at Romsey has had extracts featured on the BBC Radio 2 programme *The Organist Entertains*.

Jeffrey is in increasing demand as an adjudicator and is a member of the ISM's International Guild of Adjudicators, Festivals and Workshop Presenters. Recent engagements include the Cornwall Music Festival, Truro School Senior Competition; Junior Music Competitions, Southampton Music Festival, Bangkok Youth Piano Competition, Hong Kong Schools Music Festival, Steinway All Asia Youth Semi-Finals, and the Bangor International Choral Festival. Jeffrey is married to Diane, a pianist, and in 2021 realized a long-held ambition to return to his native county and settled on the outskirts of Camborne. Currently, he is the Principal Organist at St Ives Parish Church and Musical Director of the recently-formed Resurgam Choir.


